Sec. 1. 38 MRSA c. 3, art. 1-E is enacted to read:

ARTICLE 1-E

3 The Department of Environmental Protection in cooperation with the Department of Marine Resources 4 shall establish a Marine Environmental Monitoring 5 6 Program. The purpose of this program shall be to 7 conduct a study of the extent and effect of industrial contaminants and pollutants on marine and estuarine 8 9 ecosystems and to determine compliance and attainment of water quality standards under article 4-A. 10 study shall include, but not be limited to: 11

- 12 <u>l. Sources. The sources, fates and biological</u> 13 <u>availability of these contaminants;</u>
- 14 <u>2. Impact. The impact of these contaminants on</u> 15 marine and estuarine biota; and
- 16 <u>3. Assessment. An assessment of the condition of</u> 17 marine and estuarine habitats.

18 §410-G. Report required

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19 The Department of Environmental Protection, in 20 cooperation with the Department of Marine Resources, shall report to the joint standing committee of the 21 Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and natural resources and the joint standing committee of 22 23 the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources during the First Regular Session of each 24 25 26 Legislature. The report shall be due on or before 27 March 15th. The report shall address the problems or potential problems of marine and estuarine resources caused by industrial contaminants. The department 28 29 30 also shall prescribe remedial steps to address 31 problems identified in the report.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

	29 30 31 32	The marine and estuarine waters along the Maine host a wide diversity of organisms of and biological importance. There is, increasing evidence that chemical contamination	f economic however,

affecting marine and estuarine life. National publicity has begun to erode public confidence in the quality and safety of Maine's marine waters and their products. Current sampling and testing programs undertaken by state agencies are not sufficient either to assess the risk of contaminants present in our waters or track any potentially harmful trends.

8 This bill establishes a Marine Environmental 9 Monitoring Program within the Department 10 Environmental Protection to monitor and assess the problem along our coast. The bill requires 11 12 program to report to the Legislature every other year on the extent of the problem and to recommend any 13 remedial action that should be undertaken. 14

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
