11 STATEMENT OF FACT

- 12 Section 1 of this amendment amends the definition 13 of driving deer to include moose.
- 14 Section 2 moves the definition of sporting dogs 15 into the definitions section of the inland fisheries and wildlife laws. 16
- The mandatory minimum fine for many fish and wildlife related violations was recently increased by the Legislature from \$500 to \$1,000. Section 3 increases, accordingly, the amount of personal recognizance which a game warden may accept from a 17 18 19 20 21 prisoner when the arrest takes place more than 50 22 23 miles from the nearest District Court jurisdiction. 24
- Section 4 removes a provision pertaining 25 license revocation for persons convicted of 2nd fish and wildlife violations. This section is no longer necessary and should have been repealed in 1987 when the commissioner's authority to revoke licenses was increased from one to 5 years for conviction of any 30 fish and wildlife violation. 31
- 32 Section 5 the establishes same species 33 restrictions on the holder of an alien small game 34 license as currently exists for the holder of either a resident or nonresident small game license.

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- Section 6 clarifies that licensed trappers may carry a .22 caliber firearm at any time during the open trapping season, including nights and Sundays, for the sole purpose of dispatching trapped animals.
- Sections 7 and 8 update the law concerning the licensing of field trials for bird dogs to eliminate those provisions which are overly restrictive and unnecessary.
- 9 Section 9 specifically bans placing of bear bait 10 after October 31st.
- Section 10 makes it illegal to kill or wound a bear that has been treed or held at bay by another person's dogs.
- 14 Under current law, all moose legally harvested must be registered by an employee of the department. 15 16 Section 11 gives the commissioner the authority to 17 designate agents to maintain moose registration 18 stations and register each moose legally presented. This change will result in additional moose 19 registration stations, increasing service to 20 21 hunting public.
- Section 12 allows the department to utilize an adhesive moose transportation tag. This tag is printed as part of the moose hunting permit and is designed to be attached to the leg of the animal rather than to the head.
- 27 Section 13 amends the subsection pertaining to 28 illegal firearms for hunting moose by deleting the 29 reference to handguns.
- 30 Section 14 makes it unlawful for any person to 31 participate in a moose drive.
- 32 Section 15 makes it illegal to fish from any part 33 of several fishways.
- The definition of immediate supervision of ice-fishing lines is removed in section 16. The requirement of remaining within 500 yards of set lines

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- l is too restrictive.
- Section 17 clarifies that electronic fish finders are legal devices and thereby eliminates a great deal of confusion which currently exists among fishermen concerning this topic.
- 6 Section 18 clarifies that it is lawful to train 7 sporting dogs at any time.
- 8 Section 19 gives the commissioner the authority to 9 permit the use of conventional firearms in training 10 bird dogs on wild birds which have been raised in captivity.
