## FISCAL NOTE

Enactment of this bill will necessitate a General Fund appropriation of \$30,500 which has been included 4 5 in the Governor's Supplemental Appropriation requests for the fiscal year 1988-89 biennium.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would render void all ordinances of local government that make any farm or farm operation 8 9 10 nuisance. In addition, the bill would allow a defendants who prevail in frivolous nuisance suits to be reimbursed for their expenses. The bill provides funding for a position to determine if generally 11 12 13 accepted agricultural practices are being followed 14 when complaints involving nuisances are received and 15 16 to carry on other related duties.

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
