The Speaker of the House shall appoint 3 members of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall appoint 2 Senators to the commission.'
20 21 22 23 24	Further amend the amendment in section 4 by adding at the ending the following: 'The organizations representing state employees shall be notified of the commission meetings and encouraged to assist the commission in its work.'
25	STATEMENT OF FACT
26 27 28 29 30	This amendment addresses the problem in the committee amendment which did not provide for the appointing authority of the employee representative to the commission. Since all state employees are affected by the issue in the committee amendment, one

employee from one employee organization cannot
represent all state employees and employee
organizations.

This amendment removes the one employee member of the commission. The employee organizations will be notified of commission meetings and will be encouraged to assist the commission in its work. The employee organizations will then play the same role as the Attorney General and the Commissioner of Public Safety who are required to assist the commission, but who do not serve as commission members.
