STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Relating to Legal Expenses Incurred by State Employees in the Execution of their Official Duties.

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

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15 MRSA §1905 is enacted to read:

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1 §1905. State reimbursement of costs and attorneys'
2 fees to employees

3	An employee of the State or any of its political
4	subdivisions who is the subject of criminal charges
5	arising out of the employee's conduct or omission
6	while acting within the course and scope of the
7	employee's employment shall be reimbursed by the State
8	for the aggregate amount of costs and expenses
9	determined by the court to have been reasonably
10	incurred in connection with the successful defense of
11	the action, together with a reasonable amount for
12	attorneys' fees. The State shall not be required to
13	reimburse the employee for costs and attorneys' fees
14	if the employee is ultimately found guilty of those
15	criminal charges. For purposes of this section,
16	"employee," "political subdivision" and "State" have
17	the same meaning as set out in Title 14, section 8102.

STATEMENT OF FACT

19 This bill requires the State to pay reasonable 20 attorneys' fees and costs for state employees who 21 successfully defend themselves against criminal 22 charges arising out of their actions during the course 23 and scope of their employment.

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
