1 2 3	RESOLVE, Creating the Commission on Marine Research. Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, a clean healthy environment, an improved understanding of our marine resources and optimal use of our marine resources are essential to the future

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1 prosperity and quality of life in Maine; and

2 Whereas, Maine should be prepared to take maximum 3 advantage of the increasing federal interest in and 4 support for marine research; and

5 Whereas, there are several federal, state and 6 private institutions currently doing research on and 7 in Maine waters; and

8 Whereas, the Legislature believes there is no 9 clear accounting of how much overlap or cooperation 10 exists between these institutions; and

11 Whereas, the Legislature desires that the talents 12 and limited research dollars available to the State 13 should be efficiently directed towards the needs of 14 the State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 15 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 16 17 Maine and require the following Constitution of 18 immediately necessary legislation as for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it 19 20

21 established. Resolved: Commission That the 22 Marine Research is created. Commission on The commission shall consist of 5 members as follows: 23 24 four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, 3 members representing 25 the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources and 26 one member representing the Joint Standing Committee 27 28 Education; and one Senator appointed by the on 29 Senate, representing the President of the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources and the Joint 30 31 Standing Committee on Education.

32 hold an organizational The commission shall 33 meeting at the call of the Chairman of the Legislative 34 Council within 30 days of adjournment of the Legislature. At this meeting, the commission shall 35 elect a chairman from within the membership. 36 The 37 commission shall meet as necessary to develop recommendations. At least 2 public hearings shall be 38

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1 held to solicit public input and comments. Members 2 shall receive per diem and reimbursement for expenses 3 for meals and travel upon application to the Executive 4 Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further

Report. Resolved: That this commission shall report its findings, together with any legislative recommendations, to the First Regular Session of the ll4th Legislature not later than February 15, 1989. The commission's report shall:

10 1. Identify the areas of marine-related research 11 conducted at federal, state and private institutions 12 and the level of support;

13 2. Outline the degree of cooperation and 14 coordination between the various research institutions 15 operating within the State;

16 3. Develop a compendium of research gaps and 17 needs and an over-all state policy and work program 18 for state-supported marine research; and

19 4. Develop recommendations for state actions and 20 funding to support this policy and program; and be it 21 further

22 Cooperation from state agencies and university. 23 Resolved: That the Department of Marine Resources, 24 Planning Office, the the State Department of 25 Educational and Cultural Services, the Department of 26 Environmental Protection and the University of Maine System shall outline their priorities and activities 27 28 in marine research and cooperate with the commission 29 as it requests; and be it further

30 Staff support. Resolved: That staff support 31 shall be requested from the Legislative Council; and 32 be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following
 funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry
 out the purposes of this resolve.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

15 Currently, there are a myriad of federal, state and private institutions doing research on and in state waters. Neither the Legislature nor the 16 17 18 executive branch appears to have a clear grasp of how 19 well this work is serving the State's people and 20 industries. Research goals appear often driven more by the State's needs; 21 by available funding than 22 coordination and cooperation appear to be inadequate; 23 and there seems to be no overarching vision to guide the State's marine research. 24

More importantly, increasing pressure on our marine resources from development, tourism, fishing 25 26 Ż7 and pollution make it imperative to step up our 28 efforts to restore, protect and maintain the health of 29 environment and our marine to improve our understanding of its workings. In addition, the prospects of increased federal interest in and support 30 the 31 32 for marine research are rapidly improving and the 33 State needs to be ready to take best advantage of them.

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This resolve establishes the Commission on Marine Research to accomplish these purposes.
