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20 ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE IN RETRAINING AND EDUCATION PROGRAM

22 §3781. Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program established

- 1. Administration. The Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program shall be administered by the Department of Human Services and jointly operated by the Department of Human Services, the Department of Labor and other state agencies having responsibilities relating to the goals of this program. The Department of Human Services may contract with the Department of Labor to implement this program in selected areas of the State.
 - 2. Purpose. The purpose of this program is to provide services and support to recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children and food stamps and to reduce dependence on public assistance. The principal goal shall be to assist the recipient in securing stable employment which pays wages sufficient to maintain adequate family income without public

- 1 assistance and to increase the basic life skills and 2 self-confidence of the recipient.
- 3 3. Contract. The department and the client shall enter into a contract to embody the goals of the client and the services and support of the program.

6 §3782. Program

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- 1. Services and support. Services and support shall be made available as appropriate or needed to meet education and employment plans for program participants and shall include those which are provided under relevant provisions of chapter 1053, Aid to Dependent Children; chapter 1054, the Job Opportunities Act of 1981; Title 20-A, chapter 315, Adult Education; Title 20-A, chapter 431, Maine Vocational-Technical Institute System; Title 26, chapter 21, the Displaced Homemakers Act; and Title 26, chapter 25, the Job Training Partnership Act.
- 18 2. Responsibilities. The program shall be 19 jointly operated by the Department of Labor and the 20 Department of Human Services.
- A. In areas where the Department of Human Services and the Department of Labor jointly provide service, the Department of Human Services is responsible for coordinating the following functions: Identification of the program participant's pretraining needs: provisions of 21 22 23 24 25 participant's pretraining needs; provisions of prevocational training as it relates to social 26 27 development and life skills adjustment; provision 28 29 of support services; and case management services 30 for the participant's period of enrollment. The 31 Department of Labor is responsible 32 coordinating the following functions: Identification of training needs; provision of prevocational training as it relates to 33 prevocational training as it relates to employability development; provision of skills 34 35 training; provision of access to education; and 36 37 job placement.
 - B. In areas where the Department of Human Services contracts with the Department of Labor, all the functional responsibilities referenced in paragraph A shall be assumed by the Department of

- Labor's job training program established pursuant
 Title 26, chapter 25.
- 3 §3783. Transitional support services

The Department of Human Services shall establish a program to provide transitional support services, as 5 6 appropriate and needed, to include, but not be limited to, transportation, respite care and other child care services, to former recipients of the Aid to Families 7 8 with Dependent Children program who have become ineligible for services under that program because of earnings from employment obtained as a result of participation in the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program. Transitional support services may be available to families for up to 12 months beginning with the month in which such 10 11 12 13 14 months beginning with the month in which such 15 16 ineligibility begins and shall be available only in 17 the months in which the caretaker relative is employed.

18 §3784. Medical assistance program

- 1. Program established, eligibility. The department may provide extended medical assistance to former recipients of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program who have become ineligible for financial assistance under that program because of earnings from employment obtained as a result of participation in the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program. Families with gross monthly income equalling more than 150% of the federal poverty income guidelines shall be ineligible for extended medical assistance under this section.
- 2. Duration and scope of coverage. The extended medical assistance shall be limited to 12 months beginning with the month in which ineligibility begins and shall be provided only in months in which the caretaker relative is employed. The scope and amount of medical assistance provided under this section shall be the same as if the family were receiving cash assistance under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.
- 3. Coverage provided by private insurers. The
 department may pay a family's expense for premiums,
 deductibles, copayments or similar costs for health

- insurance or other health coverage available from any insurer authorized to write insurance in this State, offered by the employer of a caretaker relative, or available from some other program providing medical coverage if doing so would be more cost effective. In the event that the department chooses to purchase coverage for the participant, the family is nevertheless eligible for the full extent of medical assistance coverage provided in subsection 2.
- 4. Adoption of Medicaid option. The department shall adopt the 6-month extension of Medicaid available to states under the United States Social Security Act, United States Code, Title 42, Section 602(a)(37).
- 5. Payment requirements. No family receiving extended medical assistance under this section whose gross monthly income equals or is less than 110% of the federal poverty income guidelines established as required by the United States Omnibus Budget required by the United States Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, Public Law 97-35, Sections 652 and 673 (2), shall be required to pay any premium,
- deductible, copayment or similar charge for such
- assistance.
- Families with gross monthly income over 110%, but no more than 150%, of the federal poverty income guidelines shall pay a monthly premium for such assistance in accordance with a graduated scale. The average payment under the graduated scale shall be \$28.00 per month.

- <u>6. Third party liability. The department shall</u> seek reimbursement from any 3rd parties who are liable to pay for medical care and services available under
- this section in all cases where the amount expect
- reasonably reimbursement the state can recover exceeds the costs of such recovery.
- 7. Effective date, sunset. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this section shall take effect on January 1, 1989 and shall be repealed on June 30,
- 1989.
- §3785. Rules

- The department shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, for the implementation of this chapter.
- Rules governing services provided under this chapter shall apply equally to all participating Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients, whether those services are provided by the Department of Human Services or the Department of Labor.

10 §3787. Availability of funds

- Nothing in this chapter may be construed to mean that any department, agency, institution or program shall be required to obligate or expend funds beyond existing funds available to them for these purposes.

- Sec. 9. Report. The Department of Human Services and the Department of Labor shall jointly submit a report to the joint standing committee having jurisdiction over human resources by February 14, 1990.
- The report shall be based on an analysis of all relevant characteristics of the target population.
 The evaluation framework shall include relevant indicators of progress toward goals and be capable of furnishing geographic and other comparisons.
- 31 Sec. 10. Repeal. This Act shall be repealed on 32 July 1, 1990.

29 FISCAL NOTE

This bill will require a General Fund appropriation of \$5,524,353 in fiscal year 1989, a federal allocation of \$8,411,269, and a special revenue allocation of \$341,191. This bill creates 89 positions: Twenty-four General Funded, 52 federally funded and 13 from special revenue. There is approximately \$5,636,853 included in the Supplemental Budget for Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program. The programs enacted by this bill will require additional General Fund

- l appropriations in fiscal year 1990, increased Aid to
- 2 Families with Dependent Children Standard of Need and
- 3 Medicaid benefits (\$450,000) and other miscellaneous
- 4 increases (\$310,000).

5 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the original bill. It is the minority report of the committee. It proposes a revision of the public assistance system by establishing the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program (Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education). It makes several other changes in current law related to public

13 assistance.

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Section 1 authorizes the Department of Human Services to participate in the determination of eligibility for various subsidies of telephone costs for low-income people as established by the Public Utilities Commission.

Section 2 authorizes the Department of Human Services to seek a waiver from federal regulations regarding eligibility requirements for Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits. If the waiver is approved, recipients with children as young as 3 years old would be required to register in the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program in order to be eligible for Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits. Current law require recipients with children as young as 6 years old to register in the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program. The exemptions which exist in the current rederal laws and regulations would still apply to the recipients with which the younger children. Under this amendment, recipients who volunteer are given priority for the Additional Support for People in Retraining No one will Education Program support and services. be required to participate without necessary support services being available.

Section 2 also enacts a mandatory registration

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- requirement for the Family Services Program (FSP) for teenage parents who are recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children. Failure to register and actively participate in the program will not result in ineligibility for basic Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits; however, supplemental support services, such as child care and transportation, may be withheld pending participation in the program.
- Section 3 includes first-time pregnant women under the age of 20 years in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program during the last trimester of their pregnancy and authorizes the department to seek a waiver to limit that program to teenagers. This section shall not be implemented unless the waiver is approved.
- Section 3 also requires the Department of Human 16 Services to notify the Joint Standing Committee on 17 Human Resources of any request for waivers from the 18 19 Federal Government concerning the Aid to Families with 20 Dependent Children, WEET, and Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program and Emergency Assistance Program as they relate to 21 22 the Additional Support for People 23 in Retraining and 24 Education Program.
- Sections 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9 establish the Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program. The components of this proposal, under this amendment, are as follows.
- 1. The goal of Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program is to assist people in getting jobs which pay well enough to support their families without public assistance and to increase their basic life skills and self-confidence.
- 34 2. It shall be administered by the Department of Human Services and jointly operated by the Department of Human Services and the Department of Labor and 35 36 and 37 other state agencies having Additional Support 38 People in Retraining and Education Program 39 responsibilities.
- 40 3. The Department of Human Services and the 41 Additional Support for People in Retraining and

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- 1 Education Program recipient shall enter into a 2 contract to provide Additional Support for People in 3 Retraining and Education Program support and services 4 to help the client meet program goals.
- Services and support shall be provided under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children and the 6 JTPA programs. The program shall be jointly operated by the Department of Labor and the Department of Human 7 8 Services. The State will be divided into areas where 9 10 the Department of Labor and the Department of Human 11 Services jointly provide services and areas where the Department of Labor provides services under contract 12 with the Department of Human Services. 13
 - 5. Transitional support services such as transportation, respite care and child care shall be provided to Additional Support for People in Retraining and Education Program recipients who become employed and lose their Aid to Families with Dependent Children eligibility. Respite care has also been added as a support service under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.
- 22 Additional Support for People The Retraining and Education Program will provide extended 23 medical assistance for Additional Support for People 24 in Retraining and Education Program recipients who 25 become employed and lose their eligibility for Medicaid. The medical assistance shall be the same as 26 27 28 if the family were receiving cash assistance under Aid 29 to Families with Dependent Children. Families with 30 income under 110% of the federal poverty income guidelines will not be required to pay any premium, 31 deductibles or copayments. Families with income of 110% to 150% of the federal poverty income guidelines will pay a portion of the premium, based on their earnings. Families with income over 150% of the 32 33 34 35 federal poverty guidelines will not 36 receive 37 supplement. The supplement shall be available for up to 12 months after the recipient becomes ineligible 38 39 for Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits. Federal changes in the program 40 Medicaid 41 anticipated within the next year. The assistance component of Additional Support for People 42 in Retraining and Education Program will sunset June 43 44 30, 1989.

1	The Department of Human Services shall report to
2	the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources on the
3	implementation of this program by February 14, 1990.
	The Additional Support for People in Retraining and
5	Education Program is repealed July 1, 1990.
6	The appropriation in this bill also provides funds
7	for additional staff in the Resource Recovery Unit and
8	the Child Support Enforcement Unit.
