STATEMENT OF FACT

11 this bill is to make several The purpose of 12 changes in existing law to assist the State Board of Education in carrying out its duties. First, 13 to clarify the position of the state board, the bill 14 15 specifically provides for the physical and administrative autonomy of the board in discharging 16 17 its educational policy-making responsibilities. The 18 Department of Educational and Cultural Services is to provide technical assistance to the board. Second, to 19 20 assure more direct public representation on the state 21 board, the bill requires appointees to be regionally 22 representative and to possess educational knowledge The bill also reduces the length of 23 and experience. 24 terms from 5 years to 3 years. Third, to provide 25 adequate compensation, the bill clarifies that any 26 board member will be compensated for per diem and 27 expenses incurred in performing board 28 responsiblities. Finally, to enhance the board's 29 independent position, specific authority to hire support staff and to contract for services is added to 30 31 the board's powers and duties.

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
