5 STATEMENT OF FACT

- 6 This amendment adds one deputy director within 7 the office of the executive director of the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System.
- In addition, the amendment adjusts the selection process of the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System so that the retiree member selected by the board members would be selected by the Governor 10 11 12 13 to represent the taxpayers.
- 14 The amendment eliminates the provision whereby the salaries of the executive director and the associate directors would be set by the board. It also eliminates the specific dollar allocation for the 15 16 17 hiring of the new deputy director. 18
