Whereas, of Acts the 13 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days 14 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 15 Whereas, the marking of safety hazards on Maine's 16 lakes is necessary for the coming boating season; and Whereas, this Act will not become effective until after the majority of the boating season has passed, 17 18 19 unless enacted as an emergency; and 20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the 21 22 23 24 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 25 now, therefore, 26 Further amend the Bill by striking out all of 27 section 1. 28 Further amend the Bill in section 2 in the first

1 paragraph after the amending clause in the last line 2 (page 2, line 19 in L.D.) by striking out the 3 following: "a reasonable period of time" and 4 inserting in its place the following: '<u>30 days</u>'

5 Further amend the Bill in section 2 by striking 6 out all of the 2nd paragraph from the end (page 2, 7 lines 20 to 22 in L.D.).

8 Further amend the Bill by renumbering the sections 9 to read consecutively.

10 Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end 11 before the statement of fact the following:

12 'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 13 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 14 approved.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

16 The purpose of this amendment is to add an 17 emergency preamble and emergency clause and to 18 establish an expedited procedure for a municipality to 19 mark safety hazards on lakes on its own initiative. 20 The amendment maintains the existing requirement that 21 marking systems conform to a uniform marking system 22 established by the Bureau of Parks and Recreation.
