The Maine Veterans' Homes shall work cooperatively with appropriate provider and consumer groups, including the Department of Human Services, the Maine Committee on Aging, the Maine Health Care Association, the Home Care Alliance of Maine and the Maine Hospital Association, in order to develop and implement appropriate geriatric training programs.
18 19 20	2. Manual; training and educational programs. The Maine Veterans' Homes, in concert with the groups listed in subsection 1, shall:

The Maine Veterans' Homes shall establish a demonstration project utilizing the concept of a teaching nursing home, in collaboration with appropriate provider and consumer groups, as a mechanism to increase the number of health care providers with improved capabilities to deliver geriatric care to the State's elderly population.
- 9 4. Fees. The Maine Veterans' Homes shall charge fees for the educational programs and materials provided under this section. The fees charged shall be based on the costs of providing the educational materials.
- 14 5. Federal funds. The Maine Veterans' Homes shall work with the Department of Human Services in order to obtain maximum federal financial participation in fulfilling the purposes of this section.
- 19 6. Other funding sources. The Maine Veterans'
 20 Homes shall seek, in conjunction with appropriate
 21 provider and consumer groups, permanent sources of
 22 funding for the continuation of this demonstration
 23 project on a self-sustaining basis.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to implement certain of the recommendations set forth in recent legislative studies and reports.

The Joint Select Committee on Nursing Care Needs of the 112th Legislature stated in part in its report of March 1986:

"[G]eriatric and gerontology training should be required for all staff dealing with the elderly in a long term care setting. These requirements can and should be incorporated in training programs for long term care staff."

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A report to the Committee on Human Resources, as required by Public Law 1985, chapter 738, directs the Department of Human Services to work cooperatively with the Maine Health Care Association to develop a certification program for those who are responsible for supervision of certified nurse assistants and aides-in-training.

12 13 This bill establishes, on a 3-year demonstration basis, a training program for health care providers 14 15 and state Medicaid surveyors. This bill requires the principles of 16 changes in reimbursement 17 long-term care facilities to reimburse Medicaid 18 certified providers of service sending participants to that the Maine 19 the programs. 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3-year demonstration period.
