STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Allow Greater Flexibility in Education, Financial Assistance, Training and Wages Relating to Health Care Facilities Experiencing Labor Shortages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA c. 424 is enacted to read:

23	The Maine Health Care Workers' Scholarship and	
24	Loan Program is established to promote availability of	
25	needed health care workers who desire to work in this	
26	State.	
27	1. Fund created. The Maine Health Care Workers'	
28	Scholarship and Loan Fund, a nonlapsing,	
29	Scholarship and Loan Fund, a nonlapsing, interest-earning, revolving fund, shall be created by	
30	the commissioner. All unexpended funds shall be	
31	carried forward in the fund. All funds shall be invested by the Treasurer of State and the fund may	
32	invested by the Treasurer of State and the fund may	
33	receive, invest and expend money from gifts, grants,	
34	bequests and donations, in addition to money	
35	appropriated by the State.	

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Administration. The fund shall be 2. administered by the department.

3. Disbursements from fund. If the Commissioner 3 of Human Services determines, pursuant to this section, that a shortage of health care workers exists, any resident of the State who demonstrates an interest in working in a Maine health care institution may apply for a scholarship loan for the purpose of educational or training expenses from an accredited educational institution or program.

<u>4. Agreement and repayment.</u> Unless otherwise forgiven, each recipient of a loan shall enter into an 11 12 13 agreement with the commissioner which provides for repayment of the loan plus interest upon conclusion of 14 15 the educational program.

5. Forgiveness of indebtedness. One fourth of the indebtedness shall be forgiven for each year in which a person with a loan from this fund practices 16 17 18 19 that person's profession with a Maine health care 20 povider.

21 §12103. Rules

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22 The commissioner shall establish rules pursuant to 23 Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title ŝ, the chapter 375, necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter, except that the Commissioner of Human Services, after consultation with the Commissioner of 24 25 26 Labor, shall develop rules and report annually to the 27 commissioner for determining those classifications of health care workers for which there is a shortage. 28 29

30 §12104. Administration expenses

The commissioner shall administer this scholarship 31 32 program and loan fund from the funds allocated; annual 33 administrative costs shall not exceed 5% of the annual 34 appropriation.

Those adjustments 37 38 may be made during the course of a payment year. 39 A hospital shall be entitled to an adjustment н. 40 to its financial requirements not otherwise provided for in its base year for reasonable 41

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educational benefits provided to any of its employees enrolled in a program to become an allied health care professional. An allied health care professional shall include, but not be limited to, nurses, certified nurse assistants, occupational therapists, physical therapists, radiology therapists and respiratory therapists. To qualify for this adjustment, a hospital shall demonstrate need for such personnel.

A hospital shall be entitled to an adjustment to its financial requirements not otherwise provided for in its base year for reasonable costs incurred recruiting nurses or other allied health care personnel. Reasonable costs shall include, but not be limited to, agency fees, assumption by the hospital of directly related health care educational loans of the employee, advertising and travel costs. To qualify for this adjustment, a hospital shall demonstrate need for such trained health care workers.

Appropriation. 21 Sec. 4. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 22 23 purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The increasing shortage of nursing and other 11 health care personnel is having serious consequences 12 for health care in this State. This bill provides 13 funds for scholarships and loans through a health care 14 worker loan fund to be administered by the Department of Educational and Cultural Services and operated in a 15 16 manner similar to the State's physician loan fund. It 17 will cover allied health professionals, including registered nurses, licensed pratical nurses, certified 18 19 nurse assistants, occupational therapists and physical 20 therapists.

In addition, the bill provides mechanisms for hospitals to recover certain education and training costs incurred on behalf of their employees and for reimbursement of wage and benefit costs meeting certain tests and standards.

The sections amending the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 396-D, subsection 9, paragraphs E and G are necessary to clarify a conflict.

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
