STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Provide a Special Exemption to Bangor Pre-Release Center Employees for Service Retirement Benefits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

5 MRSA \$17851, sub-\$11, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §\$5 and 7, is amended to read:

1 11. Maine State Prison employees. The warden or 2 deputy warden of the Maine State Prison, any officer or employee of the Maine State Prison employed as a guard or in the management of prisoners or any person employed as the supervising officer of those officers 3 4 5 6 employees qualifies for a service retirement or 7 benefit if he:

- 8 A. Was employed in one of those capacities before
 9 September 1, 1984, and:
- 10(1) Completes 20 years of creditable service11in one or more of those capacities; and
- 12 13
- (2) Retires upon or after reaching the age of 50 years; or
- 14 в. Was employed in one of those capacities after 15 August 31, 1984, and completed 25 of years 16 creditable service in one or more of those 17 capacities.
- Notwithstanding any other provision in this section, no person in the employ of the Bangor Pre-Release Center on the effective date of this subsection who 18 19 20 21 would have qualified for a service retirement benefit if the Bangor Pre-Release Center had administrative responsibility of the 22 had remained the 23 Maine State 24 Prison may be denied such a benefit by virtue of the 25 transfer of that responsibility to the Charleston Correctional Facility. 26

STATEMENT OF FACT

28 The Department of Corrections wishes to transfer 29 responsibility for Bangor administrative the 30 Pre-Release Center from the Maine State Prison to the 31 Correctional Facility. Charleston Presently, employees of the center are considered employees of 32 33 the Maine State Prison and would qualify for a service if 34 retirement benefit they were to meet the 35 The planned requirements for years of service. 36 transfer in administrative responsibility would deny

that benefit to employees of the center. In order for present employees of the center not to lose a benefit they have reasonably expected to gain, this bill is needed. Employees hired after the effective date of this bill would have no such expectation and so the bill would not give them a service retirement benefit.
