10 11	Amend the bill by striking out everything after Section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

14 15 16 17 18	l. Pick-your-own harvest. The owner or operator of any farm that allows pick-your-own harvesting shall provide notice to potential pickers of any use or application of a pesticide. Notification shall be made before any picking begins.

The Board of Pesticides Control shall adopt rules pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, establishing procedures for the notification of each person who engages in pick-your-own harvesting, of the use or application of pesticides. The rules may:
25 26	A. Include notification requirements which differ by commodity or commodity group;
27 28	B. Include provisions for oral or written notification, or both; and

Provide for development by the Board of Pesticides Control of written materials describing the pesticides most likely to have been used, how much time must lapse between the last application of a particular pesticide and harvesting, recommended precautions to limit the exposure to a given pesticide of pregnant women, children of other highly sensitive individuals and other relevant information.
- 10 Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act shall take 11 effect on January 1, 1989. The Board of Pesticides 12 Control shall adopt rules to implement the provisions 13 of section 2 before April 15, 1989.

14 FISCAL NOTE

It is anticipated that all costs associated with rulemaking, public hearings and other related expenses would be absorbed by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, utilizing existing resources.'

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill required the owners or operators of farms to notify both agricultural workers and persons who entered the farm to pick their own produce that pesticides were used on the farm.

In the amendment the requirement to notify farmworkers is dropped in anticipation of regulations from the United States Occupational Health and Safety Administration that cover agricultural employee notification. The amendment responds to public testimony from farmers and the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources that the notification provisions of the original bill would place the burden of educating consumers about pesticide use on farmers and would dissuade customers from pick-your-own harvesting. The amendment directs the Board of Pesticides Control to adopt rules under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, which require the notification of pick-your-own harvesters prior to

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harvesting. Working out the notification provisions

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in rulemaking will allow the board and interested parties to find a way of protecting consumer health without placing pick-your-own farms at a disadvantage in selling their products.
