4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

8	25-A. Pick-your-own harvest. "Pick-your-own			
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1 2 3 4 5	harvest" means any system in which a consumer enters onto a farm for the purpose of harvesting fruits, vegetables or other agricultural produce grown by the owner or operator of that farm to be purchased by that consumer.

8 9 10 11	1. Pick-your-own harvest. Each person who engages in pick-your-own harvesting shall be notified of the use or application of any pesticide in the following manner.
12 13 14 15 16	A. The owners or operators of any farm premises shall post signs in and around those premises, including at all points of ingress and egress, which shall conspicuously state the following in large type and bold face:

Agricultural worker. "Agricultural worker" means an employee or independent contractor engaged in 12 13 agriculture as defined in Title 39, section 14 2, subsection 12, including persons employed as seasonal 15 16 or casual agricultural workers. For purposes of this 17 chapter: 18 A. "Casual" means occasional or incidental; and B. "Seasonal" refers to workers engaged 19 in agricultural employment beginning at or after 20 the 21 commencement of the planting or seeding season and 22 ending at or before the completion of the harvest 23 season. -24 Sec. 4. 22 MRSA \$1471-U is enacted to read: 25 §1471-U. 31 32 33		For any agricultural worker whose primary uage is not English, the written notice ired by paragraphs B and C shall be in that

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worker's primary language. If any worker is unable to read or write, or is otherwise unable to understand the written notice, the substance of that notice shall be orally communicated to that worker in the worker's primary language.

2. Violations. Any person who fails to provide notice in accordance with this section shall be subject to the penalties provided for in section 1471-J.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

15 This bill requires the owners or operators of 16 farms to notify both agricultural workers and persons 17 who enter the farm to pick their own produce of the 18 use of pesticides on that farm.

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
