- Three members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House, 2 of whom 5 6 shall be chosen from the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife and one of whom shall be chosen 7 from the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources;
- 9 Two Senators to be appointed by the President the Senate, one of whom shall be chosen from the 10 Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife and 11 12 one of whom shall be chosen from the Joint Standing 13 Committee on Marine Resources; and
- 14 Five members of the general public to 15 appointed by the Governor, each of whom shall have a background in boating activities 16 either commercial enterprise or as a recreational interest; 17
- 20 appointments shall be made within 30 days of the 21 effective date of this resolve. The members shall 22 select a chairman. The Chairman of the Legislative 23 shall call the first Council meeting ο£ the 24 commission. Vacancies shall be filled by 25 authority responsible for the appointment; and be it 26 further
