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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD

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1 AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations from the  
2 Highway Fund for the Fiscal Years Ending  
3 June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.  
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5 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the  
6 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days  
7 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

8 Whereas, obligations and expenses incident to the  
9 operation of certain departments will become due and  
10 payable immediately; and

1       Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these  
2 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the  
3 Constitution of Maine and require the following  
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the  
5 preservation of the public peace, health and safety;  
6 now, therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
8 follows:

9       **Sec. 1. Supplemental allocation of Highway**  
10 **Fund.** Income to the Highway Fund for the fiscal  
11 years ending June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989, shall  
12 be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated  
13 in the following schedule.

1       **Sec. 3. Legislative intent.**   It is the intent

7 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when  
8 approved.
