This amount will provide a 25% increase in home-based care funds designated to reimburse home health agencies for services rendered. The Medicaid reimbursement rate for services for home health agencies is currently at the level of those rates paid for nursing home care and, therefore, would not need additional funds. Additional funds may be needed in the next biennium in the home-based care account to meet future rate adjustments to avoid a reduction in clients served or units of service provided. An additional appropriation of \$133,570 in fiscal year 1988-89 funds the increased reimbursement for the alternative long-term care and Medicaid waivered services.'
