3 2. Coordination. The Department 4 the Department of Educational Corrections, 5 Cultural Services, the Department of Human Services б the Department of Mental Health and Mental 7 Retardation shall coordinate, to the greatest extent 8 possible, their goals, education, treatment, ġ prevention and research programs. Before expending 10 any educational and training funds, a department shall submit the plans for the program to the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee established by the 11 12 13 Legislature to ensure coordination of policy 14 service.

15 Accountability. Sec. 3. The Alcohol and Abuse Planning Committee shall report to the Legislature, by the first day of each regular session 16 17 18 Legislature, the actions taken by 19 departments pursuant to the allocations made from this 20 The report shall include a description of each 21 program and actions taken expending funds 22 alcoholism : prevention, training, education, treatment 23 and research. The source of funds expended, whether 24 federal, state or private grants, shall 25 identified. In addition, the committee shall provide 26 a report on drug abuse, including a description of all 27 programs and expenditures of all funds. The reports may include recommendations and outline issues which 28 29 the Legislature, departments and the committee may
