STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

RESOLVE, to Establish the Commission to Study the Management of Water Resources in Maine.

Findings. Resolved: That the Legislature finds that some regions of Maine face rapidly escalating demands upon their traditional sources of water supply. Water resource allocation and use problems are best addressed through comprehensive and careful planning. The transfer of water out of subbasins may

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1 threaten the well-being of the people and the environment and proposals to transfer water out 3 subbasins should be looked at within the context of 4 projected local supply and demand current and 5 Information on water use and supplies in Maine water. is not collected in a coordinated manner, many types 6 useful information are not collected at all and 7 8 is the only state not participating in 9 National Water-Use Information Program of the United 10 Geological Survey. Resolved: That Commission the Commission to Study the Management of Water Resources in Maine is established as follows: The Chairman of the Public Utilities Commission; the Commissioner Human Services; the Commissioner of Environmental Protection; the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources; the Commissioner of Conservation; and the Director of the State Planning Office, or their designees: the Governor shall appoint a municipal official, a representative of a water utility, representative of commercial user of water, а statewide environmental organization and a farmer: the President of the Senate shall appoint one Senator Standing Committee on from the Joint Energy Natural Resources and one Senator from the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities. The Speaker of the House shall appoint one representative from the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources and one representative from the Joint Standing Committee Appointments shall be made within 30 on Utilities. days of the effective date of this resolve. appointing authorities shall notify the Governor and the Executive Director of the Legislative Council of the appointments. The Director of the State Planning the director's designee shall serve Office or as chairman of the commission. Study and report. Resolved: That the commission shall meet as required and may form working groups to

- 7 The commission shall identify and compile the existing 8 information on surface and ground water supplies, all

- The commission shall review the water management systems of other states and recommend the legislation or policies needed to promote comprehensive and optimal use, management and protection of the State's
- optimal use, management and protection of the State's water resources. The commission shall consider and report to what extent the State should regulate the use of water, what administrative structure is most

- water-related conflicts, the commission shall weigh the merits of: Instituting permit and registration requirements for certain water uses or water uses

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve is the result of a study by the Public Utilities Commission of the allocation of water supply rights. That study was required by Legislature because of a number of isolated but similar problems that have been brought the Legislature in recent years. It was intended provide guidance on the scope of the issue of water allocation in Maine and the need for future legislation in the area.

As a result of the commission's study the Joint Utilities Standing Committee on reports this legislation to create a commission composed Legislators, department experts and water consumers to analysis of mechanisms conduct full of water a management, to identify and accumulate existing data relating to water usage in Maine, to investigate the extent of the need for increased water management in Maine and to recommend a bureaucratic activities identified needs. structure to meet any commission is chaired and staffed by the State Office Planning in recognition of interdisciplinary nature. It is required to report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature by January 1, 1990.

This resolve also establishes a position in the Maine Geological Survey to manage and coordinate the collection of water usage data and to participate in the National Water-Use Information Program. This program is anticipated to provide approximately \$15,000 in matching funds. Maine is the only state in the nation that does not currently participate in the federal program.

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
