Amend the bill by striking out all of section 9 and inserting in its place the following:

13 'Sec. 9. 20-A MRSA \$4502, sub-\$1, as enacted by 14 PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. A, \$\$20 and 25 is amended to read:

15 1. <u>General requirements.</u> Elementary and 16 secondary schools and, school administrative units 17 and vocational regions shall meet all requirements of 18 this Title and other statutory requirements applicable 19 to the public schools and basic school approval 20 standards.

21 Sec. 10. 20-A MRSA §4502, sub-§5, as amended 22 by PL 1985, c. 774, §§4 and 11, is further amended to 23 read:

5. Other standards. The state board and the commissioner shall jointly adopt basic school approval rules governing school administrative units and, elementary and secondary schools and vocational regions. These rules shall set minimum standards in the following areas, incorporating such standards as are established by statute:

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1 Teachers, who hold certificates issued in 2 accordance with chapter 501, shall continue to hold those certificates until their termination dates. All 3 certificates issued after June 30, 1988, shall be 4 issued in accordance with this chapter, except that 5 teachers holding a current certificate expiring before July 1, 1991, and eligible for recertification under chapter 501 shall receive a 5-year renewal of that 6 7 8 certificate. Teachers who held 5-year or 10-year 9 10 certificates prior to June 30, 1988, shall be considered to have held professional teacher certificates for the purpose of recertification under 11 12 13 this chapter.

Renewal of administrator certificates issued before July 1, 1991, shall be in accordance with chapter 501 and shall be valid for 5 years. All new certificates issued after June 30, 1988, and all renewals issued after June 30, 1991, shall be issued in accordance with this chapter.

Professional personnel other than teachers and administrators who hold certificates issued pursuant to chapter 501 shall continue to hold those certificates until their termination dates. 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FISCAL NOTE

11 This bill will reduce the cost to local units of 12 implementing the new certification requirements by delaying recertification of teachers, administrators and education specialists. The supplemental budget 13 14 includes a General Fund appropriation of \$1,600,000 in 15 16 fiscal year 1988-89 for this purpose. In fiscal year 17 1989-90, the Legislature will incur additional printing costs estimated at approximately \$2,000 to 18 19 distribute a report.'

20 Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections 21 to read consecutively.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this amendment is to delete several sections of the original bill which are unnecessary at this time. The bill also applies the school approval process to vocational regions, provides that, for a superintendent's certificate to be revoked for hiring uncertified personnel, he or she must do so intentionally or knowingly and grants rule-making authority to the Maine Arts Commission.

This committee of conference amendment provides for a phase-in of the new certification requirements. Between July 1988 and July 1991, currently certified teachers, administrators and other education specialists whose certificates expire will be recertified under existing requirements. Educators

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seeking new certificates and master teacher certificates will be subject to the new certification requirements beginning in July 1988. After July 1, 1991, all educators will be subject to the new requirements.

The amendment also provides for a detailed review and analysis of the certification laws to be 6 7 coordinated by the Joint Standing Committee on Education, with the assistance of the State Board of 8 9 Education, the Department of Educational and Cultural 10 11 Services and the University of Maine System. The amendment also provides for a series of informational 12 briefings to be conducted by the department to explain 13 the new certification rules to educators. 14
