1                      **AN ACT to Make the Exemption for Home Knitters**  
2    **from the Unemployment Insurance Tax**  
3    **Retroactive.**

5                      Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
6                      follows:

7                      Home-knitter exemption; tax abatement.                      Any  
8                      unpaid contribution required to be paid to the  
9                      Unemployment Compensation Fund, or any interest or  
10                      penalty assessed on those unpaid contributions under

1 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, chapter 13, due  
2 to a person performing services as a home knitter  
3 under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section  
4 1043, subsection 11, paragraph F, subparagraph (35),  
5 for any period of employment prior to January 1, 1986,  
6 is abated and no longer due to be paid.

7 STATEMENT OF FACT

8 The purpose of this bill is to forgive delinquent  
9 contributions to the Unemployment Compensation Fund  
10 which are due from home knitters for any period prior  
11 to January 1, 1986.
