## AN ACT to Change the Definition of Wine Coolers.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, Public Law 1987, chapter 275, extended Maine's bottle bill to include wine coolers but not other wine products; and

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1 2 3	Whereas, under that legislation, wine products which are not wine coolers were inadvertently included in the definition; and
4 5 6 7	Whereas, that provision is to take effect April 1, 1988, pursuant to Public Law 1987, chapter 543, this bill is immediately necessary to clarify the definition; and
8 9 .0 .1 .2	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

"Beverage" means beer, ale or other drink produced by fermenting malt, soda water or other nonalcoholic carbonated drink in liquid form and intended for human consumption. "Beverage" also includes wine coolers. "Wine cooler" means a beverage containing wine and more than 15% added natural or artificial blending material, such as fruit juices, flavors, flavorings or adjuncts, plain, carbonated or sparkling water; coloring, or preservatives, and which contains less than 7% of alcohol-by-volume.
9	A. "Wine cooler" means a beverage of less than 8% alcohol content by volume consisting of wine and:
31 32	(1) Three per cent or more plain, sparkling or carbonated water, and
3 3 4	(2) Any one or more of the following:  (a) Fruit juices;
3.5	(b) Fruit adjuncts;

)	1 2	(c) Artificial or natural flavors or flavorings;

	7 8 9	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect April 1, 1988.
	10	STATEMENT OF FACT
	11 12	This new draft changes the definition of wine cooler in 2 ways.
	13 14	l. The alcohol content must be less than 8%. The limit under the current law is 7%.
	15 16 17	2. A wine cooler would have to be made with at least 3% water and any amount of at least one other added ingredient other than wine.
	18 19 20 21 22	Not included as a wine cooler would be wine to which fruit juice but no water has been added, regardless of the alcohol content. Also not included would be wine to which any amount of water only has been added.
