#### STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT Relating to the Justification of the
Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee
Under the Maine Sunset Laws.
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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until

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after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and	
Whereas, the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Planning Committee is mandated to report on the effectiveness of the State's treatment programs as they relate to the 12,000 people served annually by all of the State's substance abuse programs; and	
Whereas, no system has been established to measure the effectiveness of the State's treatment programs; and	
Whereas, the information system that will be supported by this legislation will also provide the Office of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention with the resources it needs to meet its mandated information system; and	
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,	
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:	
Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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1 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 2 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 3 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides funds to institute a data collection system comprised of client intake information and 6-month follow-up interviews with discharged clients. The funds provide for 2.5 data entry clerks, a part-time secretary - clerk typist, state computer services and funds to hire an outside research agency to conduct interviews with former state substance abuse treatment clients.

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
