5 6 7 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Commissioner of Administration has

1 determined that certain state-owned land located in 2 the City of Portland is surplus to the current and expected future needs of the State; and

 Whereas, the Legislature finds it to be in the best interest of the State that this land be offered for sale in order that it may be available for utilization by, or for the benefit of, citizens of the State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sale of state-owned land. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Administration, through the Bureau of Public Improvements, is authorized to convey by sale the interest of the State in real estate located in the City of Portland in accordance with the following.

- 1. The State's conveyance of interest, as authorized by this resolve, will be in the form of a quit claim deed for land, together with buildings thereon, located at 3 St. John Street in the City of Portland, as recorded in the Registry of Deeds for Cumberland County, Book 1513, Page 233.
- 2. The Commissioner of Administration, through the Bureau of Public improvements, will advertise the property for sale to the highest bidder, except that the State reserves the right to reject any or all bids should the commissioner determine, on the basis of a market value appraisal of the property, that a responsive bid has not resulted from the process.
- 33 3. Net proceeds to the State resulting from 34 successful consummation of the sale will be deposited 35 as undedicated revenue to the General Fund.
- 36 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 37 cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect 38 when approved.

After conducting an appropriate legal title search and obtaining a market value appraisal, the commissioner will advertise the property for sale to the highest bidder, while retaining the right to reject any or all bids in the event that in the commissioner's judgment they are unresponsive.

Net proceeds from the sale will be deposited as undedicated General Fund revenue of the State.
