#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

RESOLVE, Creating the Commission to Study the Subject of Private Ways and Private Roads.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, considerable confusion exists as to the terms "town way," "private way" and "private road" and

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1 the responsibilities and rights of municipalities 2 regarding them; and

3 Whereas, it is desirable that this item be 4 resolved by the First Regular Session of the 114th 5 Legislature; and

6 Whereas, this is a complex issue requiring study 7 by a variety of specialized interests; and

8 Whereas, unless this legislation is passed on an 9 emergency basis this study will not be able to begin 10 until July, 1988; and

11 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 12 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 13 Maine and require the following Constitution of 14 immediately legislation as necessary for the 15 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 16 now, therefore, be it

17 Commission created and charged. Resolved: That 18 the Commission to Study the Subject of Private Ways 19 and Private Roads is hereby established. The <u>,</u> 20 commission shall study the issue of whether а municipality should maintain and plow roads that are 21 22 on private land but accessible to the public and roads 23 that are on private land but not accessible to the 24 public.

25 This study shall include the following issues:

26 l. The constitutional issue of using public 27 equipment on private property;

28 2. The issue of long-term maintenance creating a 29 requirement that this be continued and the issue of 30 this maintenance resulting in the road becoming public 31 property;

32 3. A definition of the phrase "capable of 33 carrying" motor vehicles;

34 4. The possibility of requiring that privately 35 owned roads be maintained to a certain standard by the

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#### 1 owner; and

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2 5. How to prevent disputes between municipalities 3 and land owners as to road ownership and maintenance.

In its study, the commission shall review the Attorney General's opinion of November 16, 1977, and offer to members of the public who testified at the public hearing on H.P. 1541, L.D. 2096, "AN ACT to Allow Plowing of Private or Public Ways or Roads by Municipalities" the opportunity to present testimony to the commission.

11 The commission shall present legislation as to 12 whether it wishes the various categories of roads and ways to be maintained and plowed, what name should be given to each category of road and whether it should 13 14 15 amend the various current laws to reflect these wishes 16 these laws consistent. and to make The commission shall review the following laws in this connection: The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, sections 3021, 3105, 3201, 3651; and Title 29, section 944; and be it 17 18 19 20 further

21 Appointment. Resolved: That the commission 22 shall consist of 7 members, appointed in the following 23 manner:

24 Four Legislators, at least one of whom shall 1. 25 be a Senator and one of whom shall represent each of 26 the Joint Standing Committees on Judiciary, State and 27 Government Transportation. Local and These 28 appointments are to be made jointly by the President 29 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House;

30 2. One Executive Department official selected by 31 the Governor;

32 3. A representative of the Maine Municipal 33 Association to be appointed by that organization; and

34 4. A representative of the Governor's Municipal
35 Advisory Council chosen by the council.

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Each person required to make an appointment or

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1 appointments under this resolve shall make the 2 appointment or appointments by May 10, 1988, and shall 3 inform the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 4 House, the Executive Director of the Legislative 5 Council and the Governor upon making the appointment 6 or appointments.

7 The commission member from the Joint Standing 8 Committee on State and Local Government shall serve as 9 chairman of the commission and shall call the first 10 meeting no later than June 1, 1988; and be it further

11 Meetings. Resolved: That the commission shall 12 attempt to accomplish its mission within the 3 13 meetings which are provided as a general guideline by 14 the Legislative Council. Should additional meetings 15 be required, the committee shall request any necessary 16 funds from the council; and be it further

17 Report. Resolved: That the commission shall 18 present its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by December 1, 1988. The 19 20 21 committee may hold a meeting to review the findings. 22 This committee shall present its report and any legislation to the Legislature by January 1, 1989. 23 ΙĪ a request for extension is made while the Legislature 24 25 is not in session, it may be acted upon by the 26 Legislative Council; and be it further

27 Staff assistance. Resolved: That, if staff 28 assistance is desired, assistance shall be requested 29 from the Legislative Council; and be it further

30 Agency cooperation. Resolved: That all agencies and departments of State Government and in particular the Department of the Attorney General and 31 32 33 the Department of Transportation shall cooperate with 34 the committee and shall expeditiously provide the committee with the information and materials that 35 it needs; and be it further 36

37 **Compensation.** Resolved: That the members of 38 the commission who are Legislators shall receive the 39 legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised

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Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further

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**Appropriation.** Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
