- 1 <u>l. Definitions. As used in this section, unless</u>
  2 the context otherwise indicates, the following terms
  3 have the following meanings.
- A. "Elementary or secondary school" means any public elementary or secondary school approved in accordance with Title 20-A, chapter 206, subchapter I.
- B. "Principal" has the same meaning as defined in Title 20-A, section 1, subsection 21.
- 10 C. "Student" means any elementary or secondary
  11 student enrolled in an elementary or secondary
  12 school as defined in Title 20-A, chapter 1.
- D. "Tobacco use" includes smoking, which means carrying or having in one's possession a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or other object giving off or containing any substance giving off smoke, and the use of smokeless tobacco.
- 18 2. Prohibition. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4, no student or school employee is allowed to use tobacco in the buildings or on the grounds of any elementary or secondary school while school is in session.
- 23 3. Exceptions. Tobacco use may be permitted in classrooms only as part of a bona fide demonstration during a class lesson, with prior notice being given to the school's administrator.
- 27 4. Employees. School employees are prohibited from tobacco use in school buildings or on school grounds, except that a local school board may establish a designated smoking area or areas in 28 29 30 accordance with section 1580-A, subsection 3, and 31 employees may reopen collective bargaining negotiations in accordance with section 1578-A, 32 33 subsection 4, for the purpose of bargaining for 34 35 smoking areas. Any school employee smoking area shall be located away from areas frequented by students. 36

5 6. Enforcement. The principal of the elementary or secondary school, or the principal's designee, shall enforce the law prohibiting and restricting tobacco use under this section.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The purpose of this new draft is to clarify the 11 prohibition on smoking in schools embodied in the original bill. The new draft prohibits tobacco use, including the use of smokeless tobacco, by students or 12 13 14 school employees in school buildings or on 15 grounds during school hours unless part of a bona fide 16 education demonstration or unless a designated smoking 17 area has been established for employees under the 18 Workplace Smoking Act of 1985 or unless employees have 19 collectively bargained for a smoking area 20 accordance with the smoking in public building laws. The new draft requires any smoking area established in 21 22 a school to be located away from areas frequented by students. The new draft clarifies that smoking in schools by members of the public is governed by the 23 24

smoking in publicly owned buildings laws.
