- 3. Report. The board of trustees shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over business legislation as to the progress toward the establishment of certified nursing assistant career ladder programs in the institutes and the effectiveness of the scholarships offered under section 12716, subsection 4, in attracting students into nursing.
- 28 Sec. 4 Sunset. The Maine Revised Statutes, 29 Title 20-A, section 12716, subsection 4, and section 30 12719 are repealed effective June 30, 1989.
- 31 Sec. 5 Appropriation. The following funds are 32 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 33 purposes of this Act.
