12 13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15	Whereas, the Department of Administration and the
16	organizations representing state employees have been
17	engaged in collective bargaining with respect to job
18	classification standards; and
19	Whereas, the collective bargaining process stopped
20	as a result of the sunset provision within the law
21	providing for collective bargaining of these
22	standards; and
23 24	Whereas, it is necessary to continue collective bargaining of the standards as soon as possible; and
25	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these
26	facts create an emergency within the meaning of the
27	Constitution of Maine and require the following
28	legislation as immediately necessary for the
29	preservation of the public peace, health and safety;

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 980, L.D. 2605

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 2 follows:'

3 Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end 4 before the Statement of Fact the following:

5 'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 6 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 7 approved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

9 This amendment adds an emergency preamble and an 10 emergency clause to the bill to enable collective 11 bargaining to immediately get underway. Collective 12 bargaining of job classification standards has been 13 temporarily halted as a result of the effect of a 14 sunset provision in the law. This process needs to 15 continue as soon as possible.
