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HOUSE AMENDMENT " *A* " to H.P. 1914, L.D. 2613,  
Bill, "AN ACT to Establish the Maine Commission on  
Agent Orange and Radiation Information."

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Amend the Bill by striking out all of the title  
and inserting in its place the following:

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'AN ACT to Establish the Maine Information  
Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation.'

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Further amend the Bill by striking out all of  
section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

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'Sec. 1. Commission established. The Maine  
Information Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation  
is established. The commission shall consist of 9  
members, 7 of whom shall be chosen as follows: Two  
Vietnam veterans and one atomic veteran, as defined in  
this Act, jointly appointed by the President of the  
Senate and Speaker of the House; 2 members of  
veterans' service organizations chosen by the  
Veterans' Coordinating Committee; the Director of  
Disease Control and the Director of the Environmental  
Health Unit from the Department of Human Services.  
The President of the Senate shall appoint one Senator  
and the Speaker of the House shall appoint one  
Representative. One of the Legislators appointed  
shall be from the Joint Standing Committee on Human  
Resources and one from the Joint Standing Committee on  
Aging, Retirement and Veterans.'

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1914, L.D. 2613

1 Further amend the Bill in section 8 by striking  
2 out all of the 6th to 8th lines (page 5, lines 11 to  
3 13 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

4 'Maine Information Commission  
5 on Agent Orange and Radiation'

6 Further amend the by Bill by adding at the end  
7 before the emergency clause the following:

8 'Sec. 9. Sunset provision. This Act is  
9 repealed on January 15, 1989.'

10 STATEMENT OF FACT

11 This amendment changes the title of the commission  
12 to the Maine Information Commission on Agent Orange  
13 and Radiation. It adds 2 members chosen by the  
14 Veterans' Coordinating Committee. It also sunsets the  
15 commission on January 15, 1989.
