Commission established. The Maine Information Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation 17 18 is established. The commission shall consist of 9 members, 7 of whom shall be chosen as follows: 19 Two 20 Vietnam veterans and one atomic veteran, as defined in this Act, jointly appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House; 2 members of 21 22 23 veterans' service organizations, appointed by the Governor, from a list of 5 individuals submitted by the Veterans' Coordinating Committee; the Director of Disease Control; and the Director of the Environmental Health Unit from the Department of Human Services. 24 25 26 27 28 The President of the Senate shall appoint one Senator Speaker of the House shall appoint 29 and the one 30 Representative. One of the Legislators appointed 31 shall be from the Joint Standing Committee on Human

1 Resources and one from the Joint Standing Committee on 2 Aging, Retirement and Veterans.'

3 Further amend the Bill in section 8 by striking 4 out all of the 6th to 8th lines (page 5, lines 11 to 5 13 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

6 'Maine Information Commission7 on Agent Orange and Radiation'

8 Further amend the by Bill by adding at the end 9 before the emergency clause the following:

10 'Sec. 9. Sunset provision. This Act is
11 repealed on January 15, 1989.'

12 STATEMENT OF FACT

13 This amendment changes the title of the commission 14 to the Maine Information Commission on Agent Orange 15 and Radiation. It adds 2 members appointed by the 16 Governor from a list of 5 individuals submitted by the 17 Veterans' Coordinating Committee. It also sunsets the 18 commission on January 15, 1989.

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
