HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1914, L.D. 2613,
Bill, "AN ACT to Establish the Maine Commission on
Agent Orange and Radiation Information."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of section 1
and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Commission established. The Maine
Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation Information
is established. The commission shall consist of 6
members, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Governor
to include 2 Vietnam veterans and one atomic veteran
as defined in section 2; one veteran appointed by the
Governor from a list of 3 veterans selected by the
Maine Veterans' Coordinating Committee; and the
Director of Disease Control or the director's
designee. The President of the Senate and the Speaker
of the House shall jointly appoint one Legislator.'

Further amend the Bill in section 7 by striking
out all of the first sentence (page 4, lines 35 to 38
and page 5, line 1 in L.D.)

Further amend the Bill by striking out all of
section 8 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds
are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out
the purposes of this Act.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

17 This amendment reduces the number of commission
18 members from 7 to 6. It makes the Governor
19 responsible for appointing the 2 Vietnam veterans, one
20 atomic veteran and one veteran from a list selected by
21 the Maine Veterans' Coordinating Committee. It
22 reduces the number of Legislators to one and
23 eliminates the per diem for the legislative member.
24 Changes to the appropriation reflect a reduction in
25 the amount of computer programming time.
