7 HOUSE AMENDMENT " \mathbf{J} " to H.P. 1914, L.D. 2613, 8 Bill, "AN ACT to Establish the Maine Commission on 9 Agent Orange and Radiation Information."

10 Amend the Bill by striking out all of the title 11 and inserting in its place the following:

12 'AN ACT to Establish the Maine Information 13 Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation.'

14 Further amend the Bill by striking out all of 15 section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

16 'Sec. 1. Commission established. The Maine Information Commission on Agent Orange and Radiation 17 18 is established. The commission shall consist of 7 members, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Governor 19 to include 2 Vietnam veterans and one atomic veteran as defined in section 2; one veteran appointed by the Governor from a list of 3 veterans selected by the 20 21 22 23 Maine Veterans' Coordinating Committee; and the 24 Director of Disease director's Control or the 25 designee. The President of the Senate shall appoint a 26 member of the Senate and the Speaker of the House 27 appoint a member of the shall House of 28 Representatives.'

Further amend the Bill in section 7 by striking out all of the first sentence (page 4, lines 35 to 38 and page 5, line 1 in L.D.)

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HOUSE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{D} " to H.P. 1914, L.D. 2613 Further amend the Bill by striking out all of section 8 and inserting in its place the following: 1 2 3 'Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds 4 are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out 5 the purposes of this Act. б 1987-88 7 LEGISLATURE 8 Maine Information Commission 9 on Agent Orange and Radiation All Other 10 \$8,100 funds 11 Provides for 12 travel, computer services and 13 14 miscellaneous expenses 15 for the commission and a half-time clerk.' 16 Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end 17 18 before the emergency clause the following: 19 'Sec. 9. Sunset. This Act is repealed on 20 January 15, 1989.' 21 STATEMENT OF FACT 22 This amendment makes the Governor responsible for appointing the 2 Vietnam veterans, one atomic veteran and one veteran from a list selected by the Maine Veterans' Coordinating Committee. The amendment eliminates the per diem for legislative members. Changes in the appropriation reflect a reduction in 23 24 25 26 27 the amount of computer programming time.
