STATEMENT OF FACT

For one year the Task Force on Incapacitated and Dependent Adults studied Maine's support system for the diverse population of incapacitated and dependent adults. Their report contained many recommendations to improve the lives of this population in the State. This bill appropriates funds for additional personnel to serve these clients immediately to meet emergency needs in an incremental manner and give the Department of Human Services time to study the report.

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Public Department of Human Services' Guardianship/Conservatorship Program has grown 250% in the last 2 1/2 years, with no accompanying increase in The 5 new positions will allow present staff. guardianship caseloads for and conservatorship caseworkers to be reduced and allow more specialized services to wards. Direct service time spent quardianship and conservatorship cases has increased from 9% to 19% in 1986. These are more difficult cases and require more worker time, especially to safely, keep the wards as independent as possible.

The 2nd appropriation is for a full-time staff person. The task force's top priority is a committee for the interdepartmental coordination of services to adults to address policy and service issues for adults at risk. This will be a long term effort to address needs of adults in Maine, determine responsibility for current and new services and develop a viable service system for the adult population. This work requires a full-time staff person.

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
