# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

_	AN ACT to Authorize Renneded County to Raise
2	Up to \$7,900,000 to Renovate and Expand Jail and
3	Law Enforcement Facilities for Kennebec County.
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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1987, c. 56 is repealed.

Sec. 2. To raise money for renovation and expansion of jail and law enforcement facilities for

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1 Kennebec County. The county commissioners of 2 Kennebec County are authorized to raise and expend a 3 sum not to exceed \$7,900,000 for renovation and 4 expansion of the county jail and law enforcement 5 facilities located in Augusta.

Sec. 3. Aid from other sources. The county commissioners of Kennebec County are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums herein authorized from or through any agency or department of the State and the Federal Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department for any of the purposes authorized in this Act.

14 Sec. 4. Bonds. To provide funds for the county 15 facilities, the Treasurer of Kennebec County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow from time to time upon the full faith and 16 17 credit of the county such sums, not exceeding in the 18 aggregate \$7,900,000, as may be necessary and may insure bonds therefor which shall bear on their face 19 20 21 the words "Kennebec County Capital Improvement Bonds 22 Act of 1988." Each authorized issue shall be payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2 23 24 years from the date of issuance and not earlier than 25 the year 1989, as will extinguish each loan in not more than 20 years from its date. The bonds shall be 26 signed by the treasurer of the county and counter 27 signed by the majority of the county commissioners. 28 29 county may sell the securities at public or 30 private sale upon such terms and conditions as the county commissioners may deem proper, but at not less 31 32 than par and accrued interest.

Sec. 5. Temporary notes. The county treasurer, with the approval of the county commissioners, may 33 34 35 issue temporary notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of serial bonds under this Act and may 36 37 38 renew the same, but the time within which such serial bonds shall become due and payable shall not, reason of such temporary notes, be extended beyond the 4.0 41 term fixed by this Act. Any notes issued 42 anticipation of the serial bonds shall be paid from

- 1 the proceeds of the bonds.
- Sec. 6. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued, or for which bond anticipation notes have not been issued within 5 years of the ratification of this Act, shall be deauthorized and may not be issued, provided that the Legislature
- 6 and may not be issued, provided that the Legislature 7 may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 8 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any 9 remaining unissued bonds or bond anticipation notes 10 for an additional amount of time not to exceed 5 years.
- 11 for ratification. Sec. 7. Referendum This shall be submitted to the legal voters of Kennebec 12 13 County. The dates of such submission shall 14 determined the Kennebec County of by Board 15 Commissioners but not later than 18 months adjournment of the Legislature. The Kennebec County 16 17 Commissioners are authorized to expend such funds as 18 are necessary to implement the referendum.
- 19 The county commissioners shall cause the 20 preparation of the required ballots on which they 21 shall state the subject matter of this Act in the 22 following question:
- "Shall the issuance of bonds be authorized in an amount not to exceed \$7,900,000 for renovation and expansion of jail and law enforcement facilities for Kennebec County?"
- The ballot shall also contain the following information to be determined by the county commissioners to be accurate as of the date when it is necessary to begin preparation of the ballot questions:
- 31 l. A statement as to the total debt service of 32 the requested issue divided into principal and 33 interest and indicating the interest rate and period 34 of the bond; and
- 35 2. A statement as to the county's bonded 36 indebtedness prior to the requested bond issue.
- 37 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark

placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Kennebec County Commissioners to seek approval from county voters to raise up to \$7,900,000 for renovation 25 and expansion of jail and law enforcement facilities 26 for Kennebec County. The county will supplement these 27 funds with state funds that will be appropriated under the 1985 Community Corrections Act, bringing the total project costs to an estimated \$8,800,000. This bill also repeals the authorization set out in Private and Special Law 1987, chapter 56, for \$9,500,000.

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
