AN ACT to Revise the Salaries of Certain

County Officers.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it has become necessary to revise the salaries of certain county officials; and

1 2	Whereas, it is desired to have these revisions retroactive to January 1, 1988; and
3 4 5 6 7 8	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

11 12 13	Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §2, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 391, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Notwithstanding other sections of this chapter, counties that are not required to obtain legislative approval of their budgets under section 253, shall not be required to obtain legislative approval of the salaries of county officers under this section. The county commissioners, treasurers, sheriffs, judges of probate, registers of probate and registers of deeds in those counties whose budgets require legislative approval under section 253, shall receive annual salaries from the county treasury, in weekly, biweekly or monthly payments, as follows:

)	19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27	The various sections dealing with the authority and responsibility of individual county officers require that their salaries be paid as reflected in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 2. This bill changes the figures currently in this section to bring them into line with the 1988 county budgets as approved by the Legislature. This bill also contains salaries for future years in Knox County and Aroostook County.
	28 29 30 31 32 33	The counties which are no longer required to have their budgets approved by the Legislature do not need to have statutory approval of the salaries of their officers. Currently, Cumberland County and Waldo County do not require legislative approval of their budget.
	34 35 36	Counties which have county administrators may not pay a salary to their commissioners. Currently, Aroostook County and York County have county

administrators. This bill, however, waives this no-salary provision for those 2 counties and allows the payment of salaries as specified in Title 30, section 2. It also allows the payment of \$100 per commissioner meeting in Aroostook County. The current limit for counties that have an administrator is \$75. The salary and per diem provisions for Aroostook

The salary and per diem provisions for Aroostook 8 County are not to take place until January 1, 1989.

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
