1 **AN ACT Concerning Relocation of the Maine**
2 **Emergency Management Agency Radiological**
3 **Calibration Facility.**

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
6 follows:

7 **Sec. 1. Radiation Calibration Facility**
8 **Relocation Committee; establishment. There is hereby**
9 **created the Radiation Calibration Facility Relocation**

1 Committee. The committee members are: The Director
2 of the Maine Emergency Management Agency, who shall
3 serve as chairman, the Director of Public Improvements
4 and the Director of the Division of Health
5 Engineering, Bureau of Health. The committee shall
6 function until December 31, 1989.

7 **Sec. 2. Duties.** The duties of the committee
8 include: Locating a proposed new site and facility to
9 house the Maine Emergency Management Agency
10 radiological calibration facility; determining the
11 estimated cost to relocate the facility; determining
12 the Nuclear Regulatory Commission requirements for
13 moving the facility; determining a timetable for
14 relocating the facility; and determining any state
15 actions required, including a recommendation for
16 funding the proposed relocation of the facility.

17 **Sec. 3. Report.** The chairman shall present a
18 report of the committee findings, together with any
19 necessary implementing legislation, to the First
20 Regular Session of the 114th Legislature on April 3,
21 1989.

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

23 The purpose of this bill is to assess the process
24 necessary to move the radiological calibration
25 facility from the basement of the Education Building
26 to a new location. A new site needs to be located for
27 the facility. A new facility may need to be
28 constructed. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission
29 licenses such facilities and must approve the move and
30 the proposed facility. Costs will be incurred and a
31 funding source must be determined.

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
