Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
follows:

Sec. 1. Findings; public need. The Legislature

finds that there exists a public need for the

protection, control and management of valuable wildlife habitat in the area generally referred to as the "Hebo-Hybo landfill" in the Town of Lebanon, and that this public need requires the acquisition of that land for the purpose of establishing a wildlife management area.

7 Sec. 2. Right οf eminent domain. Inland Fisheries and Wildlife 8 Commissioner οf 9 expressly authorized, pursuant to the Maine Revised 10 Statutes, Title 12, section 7652, to take by eminent 11 domain the land known as the Hebo-Hybo landfill in the Town of Lebanon, or a portion of that land, and all 12 13 materials in and upon the land or any rights necessary 14 for the construction, operation and maintenance of a 15 wildlife management area. Sec. 3. Compensation to landowners. The owners of the real or personal property shall be entitled to damages equal to the reasonable value of the property taken by the commissioner as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7652, subsection

County Commissioners upon the written application of
any interested party. If any party in interest is
aggrieved by the decision of the county commissioners,
