STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Amend the Demonstration Teaching Nursing Home Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §602-A, as enacted by PL 7 1987, c. 830, §2, is amended to read:

8 §602-A. Development and implementation of geriatric

2 Cooperation-The Maine ∀eterans⊥ Homes fi. 3 shall work cooperatively with appropriate provider and consumer groups, including the Department of Human 4 5 Services, the Maine Committee on Aging, the Maine 6 Health Care Association, the Home Care Alliance θĒ Maine and the Maine Hospital Association, in order to 7 8 develop and implement appropriate geriatric training 9 programs-

10 2. <u>Manual; training and educational programs.</u>
11 The Maine Veterans' Homes, in concert with the
12 groups-listed-in-subsection-l, shall:

A. Prepare a manual on the clinical care of
geriatric patients, to be completed by June 30,
1991, with 1/3 of the manual being completed each
year;

17 B. Conduct a series of 12 to 14 educational 18 programs annually, in different locations of the 19 State, in order to communicate with health care 20 providers and state surveyors on the content of 21 this manual;

C. Prepare a series of 6 to 8 management training
programs for nursing personnel and conduct 12 to
14 educational programs annually for a period of 3
years leading to a formal program of certification
in long-term care nursing management; and

27 D. Prepare and conduct such other geriatric 28 educational be determined programs as may appropriate within the limits 29 of the funds 30 authorized for this project.

31 Pilot project. The Maine Veterars' Homes 3. 32 shall establish a demonstration project utilizing the concept of a teaching nursing home, in collaboration 33 34 with appropriate provider and consumer groups, as a mechanism to increase the number of health 35 care with improved capabilities to 36 providers deliver geriatric care to the State's elderly population. 37

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4. <u>Fees.</u> The Maine Veterans' Homes shall charge fees for the educational programs and materials provided under this section. The fees charged shall be based on the costs of providing the educational materials.

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8 9 10 5. <u>Federal funds</u>. The Maine Veterans' Homes shall work with the Bepartment of Human Services in order attempt to obtain maximum federal financial participation in fulfilling the purposes of this section.

11 6. Other funding sources. The Maine Veterans' 12 Homes shall seek, in conjunction with appropriate 13 provider and consumer groups, permanent sources of 14 funding for the continuation of this demonstration 15 project on a self-sustaining basis.

16 7. <u>Duration</u>. The length of this demonstration 17 project shall be no longer than 3 years.

18 8. Account. The Maine Veterans' Homes shall maintain in a separate account, not commingled with any other sources of revenue, the funds appropriated for or generated by the fulfillment of the purpose of this section.

9. <u>Annual report.</u> The Maine Veterans' Homes shall submit annually to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources an audited financial statement and a description of program accomplishments for the previous year and program goals for the succeeding year.

30 10. <u>Unused funds</u>. At the end of the 3-year 31 demonstration period, any unused appropriation or any 32 funds generated by the educational programs authorized 33 by this section shall lapse to the General Fund of the 34 State unless the Legislature authorizes otherwise.

35 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are 36 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 37 purposes of this Act.

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Fund appropriation to the Maine Veterans' Home for the demonstration teaching nursing home project and to clarify the administration of that project.

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
