IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Making Appropriations for Additional Staff to the Office of Employee Assistants for the Workers' Compensation Commission.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the increased case load and informal

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1 conferences of the Workers' Compensation Commission 2 necessitates immediate additional staff to the Office 3 of Employee Assistants so that the commission may 4 carry out its purposes; and

5 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 6 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 7 Constitution of Maine and require the following 8 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 9 10 now, therefore,

11 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 12 follows:

Office of Employee Assistants. 15 The chairman 6. 16 adequate funding for an Office shall provide of 17 Employee Assistants and shall, subject the to 18 Personnel Law, appoint the assistants to staff the Augusta office and district offices. Assistants 19 are 20 attorneys, but should demonstrate a of not level expertise roughly equivalent to that of insurance claims' analysts. The purpose of employee assistants 21 22 23 is to provide advice and assistance to employees under this Act and particularly to assist employees 24 in preparing for and assisting at informal conferences 25 under section 94-B. 26 In addition, if an employer appeals a decision of the commission or institutes any 27 28 proceeding against an employee under this Act, the Office of Employee Assistants shall, upon request, 29 30 advise an employee how to best prepare for and proceed 31 with his case.

No employee of the Office of Employee Assistants may represent before the commission any insurer, self-insurer, group self-insurer, adjusting company or self-insurance company for a period of 2 years after terminating employment with the office.

The chairman shall appoint 6 employee assistants
and a supervisor supervisors of employee
assistants. After January 17 19847 the chairman may
appoint-up-to-5-additional-assistants-if7-in-the-

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1 chairman's judgment₇ the additional assistants are 2 as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this 3 subsection.

Sec. 2. Supplemental appropriations from the General Fund. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Workers' Compensation Commission the following sum to carry out the purposes of this Act.

17 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 18 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 19 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allocates funds for 2 employee assistant positions in the Workers' Compensation Commission, plus clerical support for these positions, rent, video terminals, training and furniture.

The bill also eliminates the 1984 transitional language which placed specific statutory limitations on the staffing levels of the Office of Employee Assistants.

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
