STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Amend Project ASPIRE for High School Students in the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1987, c. 57, §1 is amended to read:

Sec. l. Project ASPIRE; University of Maine System. There is established Project ASPIRE, to be

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administered by the Board of Trustees of 1 the 2 University of Maine System, with technical assistance by the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, to raise the aspirations of high school 3 4 5 students in the State and to encourage them to pursue 6 post-secondary educational opportunities. Project ASPIRE is a cooperative program between the University 7 8 of Maine System and school districts which choose to 9 participate. Project ASPIRE allows high school seniors to take regular college courses in their own schools and it may fund other activities consistent 10 11 12 with the purposes of this Act.

13 Sec. 2. P&SL 1987, c. 57, §2, sub-§5 is amended 14 to read:

15 5. Courses <u>or other activities</u> may be offered 16 during the regular school day or, if determined 17 appropriate by the board of trustees and the local 18 school board, outside of the traditional school day or 19 week.

20 Sec. 3. P&SL 1987, c. 57, §§3 and 4 are amended 21 to read:

22 Implementation and review. Project Sec. 3. 23 ASPIRE, created by this Act, shall be implemented by the board of trustees as a pilot project during school 24 years 1987-88 and , 1988-89, and 1989-90. 25 The 26 program shall be established at a limited number of 27 public school sites chosen from among those which apply for participation. These sites shall represent a balanced mix of geographical location, school size 28 29 and current percentage of students going on to post-secondary study. The purpose of the pilot 30 31 projects is to provide experience on which to base an 32 33 assessment of the benefits, disadvantages, possible 34 improvements and costs of these programs. In setting up, conducting and evaluating the pilot projects, the board shall give consideration to programs offered 35 36 37 outside the traditional school day or week, offering courses through audio-visual and computer network 38 hookups, the issue of recognition and transferability 39 40 of credits by the university system and the possibility of participation in the university system 41

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program by nonhigh school students. The board of trustees shall conduct a preliminary review of the the pilot projects and report their operation of findings to the Governor and the Joint Standing Committee on Education by April 1, 1988. A final report shall be issued by March 17 December 30, 1989.

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Funding. Sec. 4. The cost of participating in the pilot projects to school administrative units, 10 which choose to participate in 1987-88 and 1989-90 shall be funded through grants 1988-89, and from funds appropriated for this purpose on the same matching basis as the division of state and local shares in the unit's state and local allocation in the previous year. For projects which are continued after 1988-89 1989-90, the cost of participation to previous year. the school administrative unit may be added to the school unit's subsidized cost under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, chapter 606.

Any funds not spent by the end of fiscal year 1988-89 shall be carried over and not lapse until the 20 21 22 end of fiscal year 1989-90.

STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This bill makes the following changes to the 25 Project ASPIRE:

26 1. Allows Project ASPIRE funds to be used on 27 students in other grades than 12th grade. To change 28 the aspirations of students, involvement must start 29 before the 12th grade;

30 Allows project funds used on other 2. to be 31 activities than courses;

32 3. Provides for a continuation of the project 33 through 1989-90 with no additional appropriation;

34 Changes the final reporting date from March 1, 4. 35 1989, to December 30, 1989; and

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1 5. Removes the requirement for local units to 2 provide matching funds on the same local percentage 3 share as in the school finance formula.

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
