AN ACT to Prevent the Establishment of a

Maximum Limit Reimbursement for

Adjustments to the Prospective Rate for

Nursing Staff Wages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as

follows:

22 MRSA \$1708, sub-\$2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 365, \$1, is amended to read:

Τ.	2. Compensation for nursing nomes. A nursing
2	home, as defined under section 1812-A, or any portion
3	of a hospital or institution operated as a nursing
4	home, when the State is liable for payment for care,
5	shall be reimbursed at a rate established by the
6	Department of Human Services pursuant to this
7	subsection. The department shall not establish a
8	so-called "flat rate." The department shall establish
9	for each nursing home a payment rate or payment rates
10	relating to various types of care provided in a
11	nursing home. Such rate or rates shall be based on the
12	operating costs attributable to each nursing home as
13	determined by such accounting and auditing standards
14	and procedures as the department may establish. The
15	department may not establish a maximum limit on
16	reimbursement for adjustments to the prospective rate
17	for nursing staff wages. The provisions of this
18	subsection shall apply to all funds, including federal
19	funds, paid by any agency of the State to a nursing
20	home for patient care. The provisions of this
21	subsection shall apply, notwithstanding any other
22	provisions of law.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides that the Department of Human Services may not establish a maximum limit on reimbursement for adjustments to the prospective rate for nursing staff wages.
