IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Authorize Additional Staff for the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission.

4 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the 5 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days 6 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

7 Whereas, growth and development are exerting heavy 8 pressure on the lands and natural resources in the 9 unorganized areas of the State; and

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1 Whereas, these lands and resources represent 2 irreplaceable assets of vital importance to the people 3 of the State; and

4 Whereas, the recent and substantial turnover of professional staff of 5 the the Maine Land Use 6 Regulation Commission has led to an increasing backlog 7 of development applications and an inability to carry 8 out adequately the commission's responsibilities; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 10 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 11 Constitution of Maine and require the following 12 immediately legislation as necessary for the 13 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 14 now, therefore,

15 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 16 follows:

17 Appropriation. The following funds are 18 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 19 purposes of this Act.

18 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 19 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 20 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

22 The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission has 23 its recently experienced a major turnover in professional staff. At the same time, pervasive development and growth in the unorganized areas has resulted in record levels of development applications 24 25 26 27 and potential enforcement actions. The increased backlog of cases clearly demonstrates the commission's 28 inability to carry out its mandate effectively. 29 In addition, vital planning functions have been largely 30 neglected as existing staff have attempted to keep up with the application load. The serious implications of the staff situation of the commission require an 31 32 33 34 immediate increase in staffing.

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
