## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

RESOLVE, Directing the Attorney General to Study the Trade Practices of the Motor Fuel Sales Industry.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the competitive nature of the sale of

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motor fuels is in danger due to certain trade practices; and

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now, therefore, be it

Whereas, it is necessary that the Attorney General begin to conduct a study of such trade practices immediately and make a report to the Legislature by February of 1989; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety;

13 Sec. 1. Legislative findings. Resolved: 14 the Legislature finds that a free and open competitive 15 marketplace for the sale of motor fuels is in the best interests of the people of the State and that where the potential exists for harm to the competitive 16 17 18 nature of this marketplace through the consolidation of competitors by means clearly outside of state and federal law, actions need to be taken by the Attorney 19 20 21 General to enforce the state and federal laws as may

be necessary to preserve the competitive nature of the

24 Sec. 2. Study. Resolved: That the Attorney General shall undertake a study of the potential harm to Maine consumers and to the competitive nature of 25 26 the free-market economy from the sale of motor fuels 27 through the consolidation of competitors. 28 This study 29 shall examine such consolidation and sales practices 30 in light of the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act and 31 other applicable state and federal anti-trust laws; 32 and be it further 33 Resolved:

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the Attorney General shall submit a report, including his findings and any necessary implementing legislation to the Joint Standing Committee on Business Legislation no later than February 1, 1989.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect
