# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Protect the Environment around the Union Chemical Company Hazardous Waste Site.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, wastes from the Union Chemical Company hazardous waste spill in Hope, Maine, have entered the ground water beneath the site and have flowed into

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- 1 Quiggle Brook, which borders the site; and
- Whereas, a moratorium preventing the commercial use of water in Hobbs Pond, Fish Pond or Quiggle Brook, or any other use of water from those bodies that would significantly draw down their water levels, is essential to ensure that any withdrawal does not adversely affect the safety of the people in the area of the Union Chemical Company site; and
- 9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 10 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 11 Constitution of Maine and require the following 12 legislation as immediately necessary for 13 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 14 now, therefore,
- 15 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 16 follows:
- 17 Sec. 1. Moratorium established. No water may 18 be taken or withdrawn from Hobbs Pond, Fish Pond or Quiggle Brook, in Hope, Maine for commercial use and no decision on an application to take water from Hobbs 19 20 21 Pond, Fish Pond or Quiggle Brook for commercial use 22 may be made before October 31, 1989, notwithstanding 23 time requirement for processing or making any 24 decision on an application. The Maine Revised 25 Statutes, Title 1, section 302, shall not apply to any 26 application or proceeding, pending or initiated prior 27 to October 31, 1989.
- Sec. 2. Exemption. Notwithstanding section 1, the Town of Hope Fire Department may take or withdraw water from Hobbs Pond, Fish Pond or Quiggle Brook for the purpose of fighting fires.
- 32 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 33 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 34 approved.
- 35 STATEMENT OF FACT
- 36 This bill places a moratorium on the drawing of

water from Hobbs Pond, Fish Pond and Quiggle Brook located near the Union Chemical Company hazardous waste site in Hope, Maine until October 31, 1989. The bill further prohibits a decision from being made on an application to take water from Hobbs Pond, Fish Pond or Quiggle Brook before October 31, 1989, but the bill does not prevent an application from being made

during that time period.

9 order to protect existing drinking supplies of the citizens in the area of the hazardous waste spill at the former Union Chemical Company site 10 11 in Hope, Maine, it is essential that no water be drawn 12 13 prior to October 31, 1989 from Quiggle Brook, which borders the Union Chemical Company site, or from Hobbs 14 15 and Fish Ponds, the waters of which flow into Quiggle 16 Brook.

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
