STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Imposing a Moratorium on Development in the Capitol Area.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

7 Whereas, the Capitol Planning Commission and the 8 Supreme Judicial Court Plan and Design Commission are 9 now reviewing plans for a new court facility and for

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1 the Capitol Area; and

2 Whereas, the commissions require additional time 3 to complete their reviews and make their 4 recommendations; and

5 Whereas, it is vitally important to preserve the 6 status quo pending completion of these reviews and to 7 prohibit development of sites which the commissions 8 may later designate; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 10 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 11 of Constitution Maine and require the following 12 legislation as immediately necessary for the 13 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 14 now, therefore,

- 15 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 16 follows:
- 17 5 MRSA §304-A is enacted to read:
- 18 §304-A. Moratorium on development

No person may sell, transfer, develop or begin construction on any parcel of land within the Capitol Area from December 1, 1988 to February 28, 1989. The purpose of this moratorium is to preserve the status quo while the Capitol Planning Commission and the Supreme Judicial Court Plan and Design Commission complete their ongoing review of proposals for a court facility and the revisions to the Capitol Area plan.

27 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 28 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 29 approved.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will impose a short emergency moratorium on development in the State Capitol Area. The moratorium will run from December 1, 1988 to February 28, 1989.

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
