STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

AN ACT Concerning Membership on the Maine Blueberry Commission.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4312-B, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 737, Pt. A, §100, is repealed.
5	Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §4312-B, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL
7	1985, c. 737, Pt. A, §100, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

11	2. Membership; responsibility. The commission shall consist of 8 members. Five members shall be processors and 3 members shall be growers. There shall be one grower member
13	representing each of the following 3 districts: Washington County; Hancock County; and all other Maine counties. The
15	majority of the blueberry lands owned by a grower member must be within that member's district. For the purpose of this section
17	only, a fresh packer shall be considered a grower. If a member is unable to attend a commission meeting, the member may
19	designate a representative and shall inform the chairman of the commission of the designation prior to the meeting.

23	Each member is responsible for ascertaining the views of the constituency that the member represents, for keeping that constituency informed of the commission's and that member's
25	activities and for regular and prompt attendance at commission meetings.

29	If a member no longer has the same relationship to the industry as when appointed or elected or, if a grower, the majority of the blueberry lands owned by the grower member are no longer within
31	that member's district, the member shall promptly report this fact to the chairman of the commission. The chairman shall
33	declare the seat held by that member to be vacant. The member shall continue to serve pursuant to subsection 3 until a
35	replacement is appointed.

39	2-A. Selection. Processor members shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.
41	Grower members shall be elected by district by the blueberry growers in that district. To be eligible to vote, a grower must
43	have paid, or have had deducted, within the last year, the tax imposed by section 4307.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The Maine Blueberry Commission is responsible for determining how the Maine Blueberry Tax is spent as between research and development and promotion. The commission consists of 5 processors and 3 growers, all of whom are appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources for a term of 4 years.

13 This bill requires that the 3 grower members of the Maine Blueberry Commission be elected rather than appointed. For the 15 purposes of the election, the State would be divided into 3 districts and growers in each district would elect a grower from 17 that district to membership on the commission. The term for commission membership would be 3 years.
