Limitations. The distribution authorized in this section is subject to the following limitations. 21 23 A. The distribution to a municipality may not be reduced by more than the following percentages based on the distribution to that municipality in fiscal year 1988-89, 25 including the 22% one-time stipend for that year: 27 (1) Ten percent for fiscal year 1989-90; 29 (2) Twenty percent for fiscal year 1990-91; 31 (3) Thirty-five percent for fiscal year 1991-92; and 33 (4) Fifty percent for fiscal year 1992-93. 3.5 B. The distribution to a municipality may not be increased by more than the following percentages based on the 37 distribution to that municipality in fiscal year 1988-89, 39 including the 22% one-time stipend for that year: 41 (1) Fifteen percent for fiscal year 1989-90; 43 (2) Thirty-five percent for fiscal year 1990-91; 45 (3) Seventy percent for fiscal year 1991-92; and 47 (4) One hundred percent for fiscal year 1992-93. 49 Further amend the bill by inserting before the emergency clause the following:

23	This bill would eliminate all current distribution formulas of the Local Road Assistance Program and replace them with one
25	formula based on average miles maintained by a municipality. Currently, funding of \$15,806,932 for fiscal years 1989-90 and
27	1990-91 for the Local Road Assistance Program has been requested in the Governor's Highway Fund budget bill, Legislative Document
29 -	151. It is the intent of this bill to bring the allocation up to \$19,306,932 annually for Local Road Assistance, so this bill
31	requires an additional Highway Fund allocation in the amount of \$3,500,000 per year to the Department of Transportation, Local
33	Road Assistance Program, Account #05733.2. Finally, it should be understood that this proposed adjustment to the current
35	reimbursement formula will create gainers and losers of participating municipalities. However, a phase-in provision has
37	been proposed to minimize the impact.'
39	STATEMENT OF FACT
41	
43	This amendment maintains the concept of the original bill to provide greater equity in the distribution of funds under the
45	Local Road Assistance Program by providing for all municipalities to receive the same amount per average mile maintained when
47	phase-in period ends in fiscal year 1993-94. An average mile is the average of summer and winter miles maintained. Assuming full

funding of the Local Road Assistance Program at the \$19,306,932 level, this payment will be \$1,216 per mile.

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The proposed adjustment will create gainers and losers among the participating municipalities but, the amendment modifies the phase-in provision for fiscal years 1990 through 1993 to minimize the impact on any municipality from year to year.

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The amendment adds an allocation and a fiscal note for \$3,500,000 in each fiscal year. When added to the \$15,806,932 requested in the Governor's Highway Fund budget bill the annual total will reach \$19,306,932, the same as in fiscal year 1988-89, including the 22% one-time stipend for that year.
