13 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 33, L.D. 33, Bill, "An Act to Authorize the Bureau of Veterans' Services to Provide 15 Assistance to Vietnam Veterans"

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17 Amend the bill by striking out the title and inserting in its place the following:

'An Act to Provide Assistance to Vietnam Veterans and Atomic
21 Veterans and to Establish the Commission on Vietnam and Atomic
Veterans'

Further amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:

27 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 29 as emergencies; and

31 Whereas, the developing of registries of Vietnam and atomic veterans by the Commission on Vietnam and Atomic Veterans and by 33 the Bureau of Veterans' Services needs to be started this summer to make sufficient progress by the start of the next legislative 35 session; and

37 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 39 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 41 safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

Commission established 23 The Commission on Vietnam and Atomic Veterans, as authorized 25 by Title 5, section 12004-J, is established. 27 §522. Definitions 29 As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the following meanings: 31 1. Atomic veteran. "Atomic veteran" means a person who: 33 35 A. Participated in the occupation of Japan between August 1, 1945, and August 1, 1946; 37 B. Was an American prisoner of war used by the Japanese to 39 clean up Hiroshima or Nagasaki prior to the surrender of the Japanese empire or a prisoner of war who transited through 41 either Hiroshima or Nagasaki following repatriation; 43 C. Is a veteran of the Armed Forces of the United States who participated in the atmospheric testing of nuclear 45 weapons; or 47 D. Was a veteran in the Armed Forces of the United States who became exposed to radiation as a result of that person's 49 military occupational specialty code or a nuclear accident. 51 2. Radiation. "Radiation" means any fissionable material used in the composition of a nuclear weapon and any fissionable

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1 material created as a result of either a nuclear detonation or other military use of radioactive materials or nuclear accident. 3 3. Toxic chemicals. "Toxic chemicals" means any of those 5 insecticides and herbicides used in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War, including, but not limited to: 7 A. Agent Orange, containing trichlorophenoxy acidic acid 9 and dichlorphenoxy acidic acid; 11 B. Agent White, containing picloram; C. Agent Blue, containing cacodylic acid, including arsenic; 13 Lindane, mirex, dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethan, 15 D. chlordane, dieldrin, dapsone, malathion, hexachlorobenzene, 17 dinoxol, trinoxol, diguat, bromacil, monuron, tandex and dalapon; and 19 E. Any form of dioxin or tetrachlorodibenzo-p-dioxin. 21 4. Vietnam veteran. "Vietnam veteran" means any person who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States 23 during the Vietnam War, August 5, 1964, to May 7, 1975. 25 §523. Membership 27 The commission shall consist of 10 members, 5 of whom shall 29 be appointed by the Governor, including 2 Vietnam veterans, one atomic veteran, one veteran appointed from a list of 3 veterans selected by the Maine Veterans' Coordinating Committee and one 31 person knowledgeable in conducting publicity campaigns; the Director of the Bureau of Veterans' Services or a designee; the 33 Director of the Veterans Administration Center, Togus, or a 35 designee; and the Director of Disease Control or a designee. The President of the Senate shall appoint a Senator and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint a member of the 37 House of Representatives. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall jointly appoint one 39 of the members as chair. 41 <u>§524. Term of office</u> 43 The term of office shall be 2 years. Commission members may serve no more than 3 consecutive terms. 45 §525. Chair 47 The members of the commission shall select a chair at the 49 first meeting of each fiscal year. 51

Members shall be compensated in accordance with Title 5, section 12004-J, subsection 8.

<u>§527. Duties</u>

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The commission shall:

 Bureau of Veterans' Services; advice. Advise the Bureau
 of Veterans' Services on matters concerning Vietnam and atomic veterans. This shall include giving its advice and consent on
 staff hired by the bureau to provide staff assistance to the commission under section 528;

2. Registry of Vietnam and atomic veterans. Assist the 17 Bureau of Veterans' Services in developing a registry of Vietnam veterans and a registry of atomic veterans;

3. Outreach: public hearings. Develop methods for reaching 21 out to Vietnam and atomic veterans who need assistance. The commission may hold public hearings, develop public service 23 announcements and use other means to reach veterans;

25 <u>4. Advocacy. Act as advocates for Vietnam and atomic veterans:</u>
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5. Conduct study. Conduct a study of medical and other 29 problems faced by Vietnam and atomic veterans and their families: and

 6. Report. Report each year to the joint standing
 33 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over aging, retirement and veterans' matters by January 15th.

<u>§528. Staff</u>

The Bureau of Veterans' Services shall provide clerical and 39 professional staff to assist the commission.
