Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission created and charged. Resolved: That there is created the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Provision of 8 Services to Children and Families. The commission shall thoroughly review the delegation of authority regarding services 10 for children and their families to various agencies of State Government and the actual provision of those services. 12 The commission shall evaluate the effectiveness of programs as currently provided, the efficiency with which services are 14 provided within the current structure and the degree of public 16 confusion caused by the current structure. The purpose of the commission is to study a range of options for more effectively providing services to children and families and to make 18 recommendations to the Legislature and the Governor for any necessary changes. As part of the evaluation, the commission 20 shall hold 4 public meetings at various locations around the State; and be it further 22

Sec. 2. Appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 21 members appointed as follows:

 Five Legislators representing the Joint Standing
 Committee on Education, the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources, and the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local
 Government, including 2 members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate and 3 members of the House of
 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;

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2. One representative of each of the following agencies, to be appointed by the Governor:

A. The Department of Educational and Cultural Services;

B. The State Board of Education;

C. The Department of Human Services;

D. The Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation;

E. The Department of Corrections; and

F. The Division of Community Services;

3. The following members, to be appointed by the Speaker of 50 the House of Representatives:

52 A. One school administrator;

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B. One classroom teacher;

C. One member of the clergy;

- D. One representative of a juvenile residential facility; and
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E. One Head Start representative selected from a list of candidates submitted by the Head Start Directors Association; and

- 12 4. The following members, to be appointed by the President of the Senate:
 - A. One guidance counsellor;
- B. One social worker with expertise in family dysfunction18 issues;
- 20 C. One child psychologist;
 - D. One juvenile justice system field worker; and
- 24 E. One pediatrician or other physician who is engaged in family practice.
- The appointments must be made within 30 days of the 28 effective date of this resolve; and be it further
- 30 . Sec. 3. Convening of commission; selection of chair and cochair. Resolved: That the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call 32 the first meeting of the commission within 30 days of the appointment of all commission members. At that meeting, the 34 commission shall select a chair from among the legislative members and a cochair from among the public members; and be it 36 further
- Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the
 Legislature and Governor no later than December 1, 1991; and be it further

Sec. 5. Assistance. Resolved: That the commission may contract 44 for the services of a consultant or research assistant in reviewing the delegation of authority and the provision of services for children and families, evaluating the effectiveness 46 of programs and the efficiency with which they are provided, assessing the problems caused by the current structure and 48 examining alternative structures for the provision of those 50 services. The commission may request clerical assistance and assistance in managing the work of the consultant from the 52 Legislative Council. The commission may request assistance with preparation of any recommended legislation the from the

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Legislative Council. The various departments of State Government shall provide information to the commission upon request; and be it further

Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the
commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the
legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes,
Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at commission
meetings. All members of the commission, except the employees of
State Government, are entitled to receive reimbursement for
expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the
Legislative Council; and be it further

14 Sec. 7. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
